Climate-Smart Farming Training for Smallholders January – December 2023

1. Project Overview

- Title: Climate-Smart Farming Training for Smallholders
- Location: Kalulushi District, Copperbelt Province, Zambia
- **Duration:** January December 2023
- Objective: Enhance food security and resilience by equipping smallholder farmers with climate-smart agriculture (CSA) techniques, reducing dependence on expensive inputs and promoting sustainable land management.

2. Background & Rationale

- Smallholders in the Copperbelt face declining yields due to soil degradation, costly chemical fertilizers, and erratic rainfall patterns.
- Climate-smart agriculture offers solutions through conservation farming, organic fertilizer use, and efficient water management.
- This project supports Zambia's Climate-Smart Agriculture Strategy (2017–2027) and regional SDG targets on hunger, poverty reduction, and climate action.

3. Activity Components

 Training Sessions: 200 farmers trained in CSA methods including minimum tillage, composting, and crop diversification.

BARLISTRIVE YOUTH

- **Demonstration Plots:** Established to showcase CSA practices and track results.
- Organic Fertilizer Use: Promoted production and application of compost and manure.
- **Soil & Yield Monitoring:** Regular testing to measure improvements.
- Community Awareness: Field days and farmer-to-farmer exchanges organized.

4. Detailed Execution Phases

Phase 1 – Planning & Mobilization (Jan–Feb 2023): Recruited farmers, identified demo sites. Phase 2 – Training & Demonstrations (Mar–Jun 2023): Training delivered; demo plots established.

Phase 3 – Implementation & Monitoring (Jul–Oct 2023): Farmers applied CSA methods on their own fields; monitoring conducted.

Phase 4 – Evaluation & Knowledge Sharing (Nov–Dec 2023): Yields compared, lessons documented, field days held.

6. Outcomes & Impact

- 200 smallholder farmers trained in CSA techniques.
- 4 demonstration plots established across Kalulushi District.
- Maize yields increased by 25% compared to conventional practices.

Fertilizer costs reduced by 40% among participating

farmers.

- Improved soil health indicators (higher organic matter, reduced erosion).
- Farmers formed a **CSA learning group** for peer support.
